The Competition will be running as per Option 1 in the rule book - 1 round following straight onto a jump-off, with all competitors going forward to the jump-off section.

Class 1 SEIB Novice Junior Winter 70

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 70cm - 300mpm

Class 2 SEIB Novice Senior Winter 70

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 70cm - 300mpm

Class 3 SEIB Novice Junior Winter 80

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 80cm - 325mpm

Class 4 SEIB Novice Senior Winter 80

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 80cm - 325mpm

Class 5 Ri-Dry Intermediate Junior Winter 90

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 90cm - 325mpm

Class 6 Ri-Dry Intermediate Senior Winter 90

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 90cm - 325mpm

Class 7 Ri-Dry Intermediate Mixed Senior/Junior Winter 100

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 100cm - 325mpm

Class 8 Ri-Dry Intermediate Mixed Senior/Junior Winter 105

Show Jumping Team and Individual Height in first round: 105cm - 325mpm

For 2023 new pink hat tags for 2023 please check with the Official Steward to get hats checked before you jump.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES

Refer to current BRC rulebook for full details.

Junior Riders: under 18 on 1st Jan 2023.

Riders may compete in the same class as an individual and as a team member provided different horses/ponies are ridden.

Competitors can compete at more than one height

Riders will jump one round and will be run as a single phase competition. The first half of the course should be set at the second round height, with the second part of the course set at jump-off height. The second half being timed as the jump-off. The jump-off will follow straight on from the first part of the course without stopping. All team and individual members (unless the individual is eliminated in first round) will go forward to the second part of the second round (jump-off) unless eliminated in the first half. The second half will be classed as both the team and individual jump-off. This applies to teams and individuals.

Eligibility in conjunction with CR Appendix 2 & 3. Horses may compete in any competition for which they are eligible in a competition year (1 April to 31 March).

- Upward progression is permitted in the same discipline, for example a horse could do the BRC HT 90 in the summer season and BRC CH 100 in the winter season or a horse could do the 80 show jumping in the summer and move up to 90 show jumping in the winter.

- No horse may compete twice in the same team.

- No horse can be ridden over the same course of jumps on the same day. Juniors and seniors may share horses for show jumping provided the competition is split into senior and junior. In this instance horses for example may compete in the Senior

80 SJ and the Junior 80 SJ or the Senior 80 SJ and the Junior 90 SJ.

- A horse may only compete at consecutive heights in show jumping for example a horse may compete in 80cm/90cm classes or 90cm/100cm classes, provided they meet eligibility requirements and only once is as part of a team. BUT horses competing in the 70cm will not be permitted to compete at any other height in show jumping

ENTRY FEE Medical cover included.

£15 for individuals

Prelim Qualifier entries to BRC Office 21 days prior to competition date

All cheques should be made payable to “**Quantock Riding Club**” and have the name of the team(s) and club printed clearly on the reverse side. One cheque per club please. A charge of £10 will be made for any dishonoured cheques.

TIMES Times will be available on BRC Area 12 website (www.brcarea12.org.uk) on Friday 20th January.

All clubs must also have paid 2023 affiliation fees before entries will be accepted.

The Official Steward reserves the right to stop anyone who is in multiple classes if BRC feel the horse's welfare is compromised.
